Guidelines for Banners and Feather Banners

NO BANNERS OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING ELECTION BANNERS, ARE ALLOWED IN TOWN OR CDOT RIGHT-OF-WAYS

Residential Lots

1) Banners and Feather Banners are not allowed.

Non-Residential Lots

- 1) Requires a 30-day Banner Permit. \$5.00 per application.
- 2) No more than 2 banners may be displayed in one 30-day permit period.
- 3) No more than 4 feather banners are allowed per building, or if multiple businesses, four feather banners per street frontage in one 30-day period.
- 4) Only 4 banner or feather banner permits will be issued to a single applicant in one calendar year.
- 5) Banner and feather banner permits will only be issued once per quarter with a minimum of 7 consecutive days between permit periods.
- 6) Banners, single or combined with feather banners shall not exceed a combined area of 50 square feet.
- 7) Feather banners, combined with or without standard banners, shall not exceed a total combined area of 50 square feet.
- 8) Individual feather banners cannot exceed 15 feet in height and 3 feet in width.
- 9) Banners and feather banners must be securely fastened and must be placed at least 10 feet back from Town Right-of-Ways and 15 feet back from CDOT Right-of-Ways.
- 10) Banners and Feather banners may not protrude into any public right-of-way, drive aisles, parking spaces or other areas required for vehicular or pedestrian accessibility.
- 11) You must have permission from the property owner to place the banner(s) on their lot.
- 12) Date of first display must be placed on lower right-hand corner.

Election Banners

- 1) Do not require a permit.
- 2) Limited to 1 sign per ballot issue or candidate.
- 3) May not be displayed sooner than 30 days before the election and must be taken down within 2 days after election end.
- 4) All election banners must still meet all temporary sign size, location, material, and fastening requirements.
