A note from the Elizabeth Police Chief:

With tax season in full swing please be aware of IRS scams. The IRS will typically initiate contact through mailings delivered by the United States Postal Service (USPS). According to the IRS, "There are circumstances in which the IRS will call or come to a home or business. These include when a taxpayer has an overdue tax bill, a delinquent (unfiled) tax return, or has not made an employment tax deposit. An IRS employee may also view assets or tour a business as part of a collection investigation, an audit, or an ongoing criminal investigation. Even then, taxpayers will generally first receive several notices and letters from the IRS in the mail."
