Town of Elizabeth Special Municipal Election

Tuesday, September 5, 2023

House Calls for Seniors Now Available

Do you know an elderly Elbert County resident that would benefit from a home visit by one of our health care providers?

Last month ECPH shared that we have been designated by the Colorado Department of Health Care Policy & Financing as an **Essential Community Provider.** An Essential Community Provider is a health care provider that has historically served medically needy or medically indigent patients and demonstrates a commitment to serve low-income and medically indigent populations.

The growing number of elderly Coloradans poses numerous and serious challenges to our state's health care systems at many levels. In just the past two years, Elbert County has lost a Federally Qualified Health Center (Peak Vista Health Center in Kiowa), and a skilled nursing facility (Good Samaritan Society in Simla). As life expectancy increases, the risk of chronic diseases or injuries also increases. Chronic diseases related to functional decline, or the collapse of social support systems reduce the wellbeing of the vulnerable elderly, and cause excessive spending on care facilities, medical services, and emergency responders. Focusing on an upstream approach that promotes the health of vulnerable elderly people living in rural communities can help mitigate such costs.

As ECPH continues efforts to better understand how rural older adults perceive their access to healthcare, particularly in the aftermath of the COVID pandemic, and how this has affected barriers to needed services, we believe it is important for local residents and families to have convenient and reliable access to health care.

If you know an elderly county resident that can't make it to a health care provider, we may be able to help. Call us at (303) 621-3144 to schedule an at-home visit with one of our providers. Senior patients will be able to connect for 1-on-1 time with a member of our licensed medical staff. They'll get a physical, health screenings, and plenty of time to talk about their health questions. Please note this resource is limited to residents of Elbert County.
