Identity Theft Part 2 Types of ID Theft

There are several common types of identity theft that can affect you:

- Tax ID theft Someone uses your Social Security number to falsely file tax returns with the IRS or your state
- Medical ID theft Someone steals your Medicare ID or health insurance member number. Thieves use this information to get medical services or send fake bills to your health insurer.
- Unemployment ID theft Someone uses your personal information to claim (and receive) unemployment benefits.

Steps to Prevent Identity Theft

- Secure your Social Security number.
- Don't share personal information because someone asks -Collect mail every day.
- Pay attention to your billing cycles tooltip. If bills or financial statements are late, contact the sender.
- Use the security features tooltip on your cell phone.
- Update sharing and firewall settings tooltip when you're on a public wi-fi network tooltip. Use a virtual private network (VPN) tooltip if you use public wi-fi.
