## Citizen Welfare Program

### What is this?

“The Elizabeth Police Department has launched a new program named the Citizen Welfare Program. This free program allows Officers to call



the program’s clients to ensure they are okay. If an Officer cannot reach the client by phone, another phone call will be made to the client’s emergency contact. If the emergency contact does not know why the client did not answer the Officer’s phone calls, an Officer may visit the client’s home to check on them. The program aims to strengthen the Police Department’s service to our citizens and prioritize their safety and well-being.”

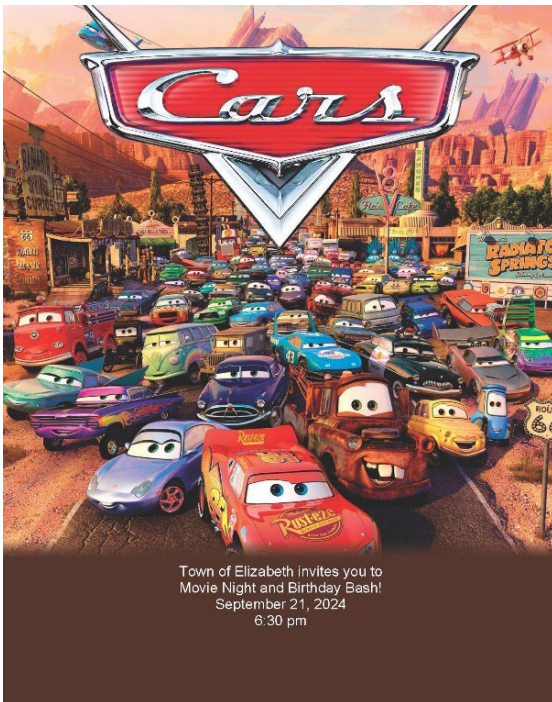
