PINES PLAINS LIBRARIES

With the start of the snow season, we would like to remind our residents about snow removal. Under Town Code, property owners or tenants have 48 hours from the end of a storm event to remove snow from their sidewalks. The 48-hour rule allows plenty of time for Public Works to remove snow from the streets, and to ensure that a property owner's snow removal does not interfere with street snow removal. The snow that is removed cannot and should not be placed on the street or public property. Rather use the snow as an opportunity to provide needed moisture for your lawn or other landscaping.

If you have an opportunity or a means to move your vehicles from the street prior to a storm that is very helpful for Public Works. When vehicles are left in place, it becomes difficult and sometimes dangerous to plow around them. It also creates an opportunity for icing and can generally interfere with drainage when the snow and ice melt.

Lastly, there are portions of the Town which have no winter parking from November 1 through May 1 of each year. Please be mindful of this. Should you find that you may need street parking, which would otherwise be in violation of the winter parking restrictions, please reach out to Public Works. In some instances, temporary arrangements can be made to allow for short periods of time for parking if no storm event is anticipated.
