Town of Elizabeth Historic Preservation Survey Results

The Town of Elizabeth's Historic Advisory Board conducted a Historic Preservation Survey from March 11th to April 11th, 2022. The survey was distributed via physical copies and digitally using SurveyMonkey. 137 responses were collected. The Community Development Department is reviewing regulations for potential updates. There will be a joint meeting between the Board of Trustees and the Planning Commission in the near future to discuss amendments to the Town of Elizabeth Municipal Code. The review of uses allowed in specific zone districts is a priority. Among the uses being discussed are short-term rentals and small-scale food and beverage processing.
