



TOWN OF ELIZABETH

RESIDENTIAL FENCE INFORMATION GUIDE

- A FENCE PERMIT IS <u>NOT REQUIRED</u> TO CONSTRUCT A FENCE, HEDGE, OR WALL ON YOUR RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY.
- FENCES OR WALLS EXCEEDING 6 FEET IN HEIGHT REQUIRE A BUILDING PERMIT TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE TOWN FOR REVIEW.
- FENCES, HEDGES, AND WALLS ARE REQUIRED TO MEET THE FOLLOWING MINIMUM STANDARDS:
 - A. Fence, hedge, and wall height will be measured from the base of the fence, hedge, or wall at the highest finished grade to the highest point of the fence, hedge, or wall.



- B. Fences, hedges, and walls do not have to comply with the minimum setbacks of the zoning district in which they are located if they comply with C and D, below. See Section 16-1-40(f)(4).
- C. Fences, hedges, and walls on corner lots cannot exceed 30 inches (2.5 feet) in height in the visibility triangle. See Section 16-1-200(a)(4).
- D. Fences, hedges, and walls in residential areas can not exceed four feet in height in required front yards or six feet in height in all other areas. See Section 16-1-40(f) (4)(b).

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT INSTALLING OR REPLACING A FENCE:

- A. Work in cooperation with your neighbor before installing a fence to avoid future disputes.
- B. The Town cannot determine the exact location of your property line. If you don't know where your property line is, you will need to get buy-in from your neighbor or complete a property boundary survey from a Professional Land Surveyor (PLS).
